Michael Zigarelli conducted a study of the Christlikeness of 5000 Christians from around the world. Disturbingly the average amount of growth over time was found to be pitiful:

However all is not lost because this is an average - some Christians are much more Christlike (high virtue Christians) while others are less Christlike. He analysed the data to find out what was different about high virtue Christians compared to average virtue Christians. He found **the characteristic that most distinguishes high virtue Christians is** <u>GRATITUDE</u>. Gratitude turns out to be a 'parent' virtue. "Growing one's gratitude has a radical and transformational effect on character because it is one of God's primary vehicles for **inducing** other Christian qualities.... Want more inner peace? Work on gratitude. Want more patience? Work on gratitude. Want to be more compassionate? etc. etc... "

"One of the major secrets to success for high-virtue Christians is that they have mastered the art of **maintaining** a grateful disposition. Gratitude is simply part of who they are, rather than being some sporadic, refreshing occurence.... They consistently think about how much God has blessed them"
